Chaplain's Column

Brother Knights and Families,

I hope you are having a relaxing summer even if you are working and staying at home instead of being at your favorite camping place! On August 15th, we celebrate Mary's Assumption into heaven immediately after her death. Because it occurs on a Monday, there is not an obligation to attend Mass. To help us understand this special Catholic feast, I share some of the teachings from two of my preaching resources, "Homily Hints", and "The Living Word."

The Assumption of Mary was declared a doctrine of the Catholic Church with the official statement of Pope Pius XII on November 1, 1950. The document includes this statement: "Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory."

Some people complain that the doctrine of Mary's assumption into heaven is not found in scripture. If they are looking for a historical narrative, they are right. But scripture is more than simple history; it is the revelation of God's love through the lived experience of men and women of faith. The stories from the Bible tell us more than the fact that Mary, at the end of her life, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven. They tell us that through the death and resurrection of Jesus, the power of our ancient enemy has been permanently overcome and the destiny of each one of us, as children of God, is to be taken up into the glory of heaven.

While this is our destiny, however, we are called to follow the example of Mary if we are to achieve it. Throughout her life, Mary united herself with Jesus. Her surrender to God's will at the time of the annunciation continued through faithfully pondering in her heart all that was happening. United with Jesus in his life and death, she is united with him in his resurrection and ascension into glory. This then is the pattern for all of us to follow.

The feast calls us to celebrate Mary who also, through the power of God, was victorious over death. Through God's loving providence she was preserved from sin as she willingly cooperated with God's divine plan for her to be the mother of the Savior. For this reason, she too, was free from the decay of the body. Her example gives us courage.


