Sacred Heart of Jesus Feast Day

This feast is celebrated from the year 1856 and celebrated after 19 days after Pentecost Sunday. This feast always falls on a Friday. The Sacred Heart is depicted in art as a flaming heart with divine light, pierced by the lance-wound, encircled by the crown of thorns, surmounted by a cross and bleeding.

The devotion to the Sacred Heart is derived from the revelations made by Jesus Christ to a French nun St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (Born on July 22, 1647 and died on October 17, 1690. Canonized by pope Benedict-XV on May 13, 1920). She said that she learned the devotion from Jesus Christ during a mystical experience. She said that she had visions of Jesus Christ from her young age and joined the Visitation Convent to become a nun. She received several revelation of the Sacred Heart and the first

revelation was on December 27, 1673 (feast of St. John). She told others that during this apparition Jesus permitted her to rest her head upon His heart and Jesus desired to make this known to all mankind. In the second apparition which took place on June 6, 1675, (on the 8th day or Octave of the Corpus Christi feast), Jesus told her 'Behold the Heart that has so loved men instead of gratitude, I received from greater part of mankind ingratitude'. After due investigation, her Convent observed the feast of the Sacred Heart privately in the year 1686 and a chapel was built in 1688 at the Paray-le-Monial to honor the Sacred Heart. Pope Pius-XII by his encyclical letter 'Haurietis aquas' dated May 15, 1956 instructed the entire church to celebrate this feast. Pope Benedict-XVI also reaffirmed the importance of the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in his letter dated May 15, 2006 written to the Superior General of the Society of Jesus.

The Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary

This name is the title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her role as the patron of the Carmelite Order. This feast is also known as the 'Scapular feast' because the Carmelite Order is using the brown scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. A tradition says that the Holy Virgin Mary appeared to St. Simon Stock, a Prior General of the Carmelite Order on July 16, 1251 and gave the brown scapular to him and that became part of the Carmelite Order. Carmelites believe the Holy Virgin Mary is a model of virtue and is also a perfect model of interior life of prayer. This feast was instituted by the Carmelite Order between the years 1376-1386, to celebrate their victory over their enemies, on obtaining the approbation of its name and constitution from Pope Honorius-III on January 30, 1226. The scapular is a modified version of Holy Mary's own garment and it gives special protection to those who wear it. St. John of the Cross credited Holy Mary with saving him from drowning as a child, leading him to Carmel and helping him from prison. The Carmelites say that this Order was first founded by prophets Elijah and Elisha on the Mount Carmel. Mount Carmel is in Israel (District Haifa). During the apparition of Holy Mary at Fatima on October 13, 1917, when the Miracle of the Sun happened (Sun became red and rotated like a wheel) the children saw the visions of Jesus, Our Lady of Sorrows and Our Lady of Carmel. The feast was extended to the entire Latin Church by Pope Benedict-XIII on September 24, 1726.
