

Nowhere else can we find the fullness of masculinity as we do in the Son of God. Only in Jesus Christ can we find the highest display of masculine virtue and strength that we need in our personal lives and in society itself. The Father sent his Son to reveal what it means to be a man, and the fullness of this revelation becomes evident on the Cross.

Herein lies the fullness of masculinity; each Catholic man must be prepared to give himself completely, to charge into the breach, to engage in spiritual combat, to defend women, children, and others against the wickedness and snares of the devil!

How do we live like a Catholic man? If we think of soldiers who do not remain in physical and mental shape, we know they will not be ready for battle.
