



Campus Corner - CCA

The school year is off and running at Christ Child Academy! We have just completed our fourth week of in person instruction. Although this year certainly looks different, we are thrilled to be back together to learn and grow as a faith community. Our current enrollment is 138 students. We are looking forward to a faith-filled school year!

Christ Child Academy has released the reopening plan for the 2020-2021 school year which can be found at www.ChristChildAcademy.com. This plan is the overview of our alignment guided with the support from the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, Sheboygan County Health Department and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). CCA has all intentions of starting the 2020-2021 school year on September 1st and students will be in school 5 days/week for in person learning with safety and disinfection guidelines in place.

MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) testing for grades K - 8 was held the week of September 21. MAPS is a computerized adaptive test which helps teachers, parents, and administrators improve learning for all students and make informed decisions to promote a child's academic growth. All students in grades K-8 were tested to track their academic growth.

It is great to have the students back in school! The last three weeks, our CCA family celebrated Mass on both Wednesday and Thursday. Grades 5-8 attend Mass on Wednesday and grades K-4 attend on Thursday. The students are celebrating mass separately this year to accommodate appropriate social distancing in church. What a blessing to be back in church together as a family in a safe and clean spiritual environment.

As we progress into this unpredictable school year, we continue to evaluate our COVID-19 mitigation strategies to ensure we are providing the safest learning environment while adjusting our instructional techniques to maximize teacher effectiveness and student learning.

We continue to expand our Chromebook utilization within our school as students in grades K-8 have each been assigned a Chromebook for use at school.
