For many people, personal finances are not what they were just one year ago. Many of our K of C councils will not be able to perform the same fundraisers that they undertook in the past due to COVID-19. Some councils utilized the Packers' game fundraisers, and this too will change this year. It is also difficult to find volunteers who want to assist with some of these fundraisers. What will become of our ability to raise funds and assist in the corporal works of mercy? This is something that local councils will need to discuss and work as a team to overcome. As a spiritual leader, I would like to offer a few simple suggestions. First, we need to prioritize charitable giving above some of our other social activities and hobbies. One priest calculated the savings he would incur if he stopped going to a fancy coffee shop every day and started drinking normal,

black coffee. The figure was over \$800 per year! Once we reprioritize some of our purchases, the next step is to literally set aside that money for charity (or at least some of it). Using my coffee example, the priest could set side half, or \$400, of the accrued savings for charitable giving while also setting aside the other half for personal hardship. One brother Knight used this sacrificial method of reprioritizing his finances to purchase the new 4th degree uniform. He first had to decide how bad he wanted that uniform versus how often he went out to restaurants. We also should remember the biblical concept of tithing. Tithing requires faith. If we save a few dollars for charity, we must also believe that God will take care of us and never let us starve. "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor 9:7). If everyone does a little, then the impact is huge. The early Church lived with a sense of communal responsibility and shared resources. This only works if people, lots of people, willingly do this at the same time. God will take care of those who take care of others. It is not always a matter of looking at our surplus money and writing a big check. It is more a matter of looking at our essential finances and sacrificing part of our livelihood for the corporal works of mercy. Remember the poor widow in the Gospel and her few small coins. This is not a fundraising letter. It is simply a reminder that despite the time of hardship, it is possible to keep this essential activity of the Knights of Columbus alive. This is something that local councils will need to discuss and work as a team to overcome. Let us emphasize the word team.

# Campus Corner - CCA

Christ Child Academy has released the reopening plan for the 2020-2021 school year which can be found at www.ChristChildAcademy.com. This plan is the overview of our alignment guided with the support from the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, Sheboygan County Health Department and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). CCA has all intentions of starting the 2020-2021 school year on September 1st and students will be in school 5 days/week for in person learning with safety and disinfection guidelines in place.

We are so excited to get back to the classroom thanks to the significant safety measures in place. Middle school students will no longer travel between classrooms, rather the teachers will move from room to room for instruction. All special classes will also travel to the students, and lunch will be staggered across three times and eaten in the classrooms. We will also be celebrating mass on Wednesday and Thursday to split the school into two groups and allow for proper social distancing and still accommodate any parents, grandparents, or friends that would like to worship with the children. Masks will be worn all day. We are prayerfully confident that this will allow us to learn together in person, after being shut down since March 16!
