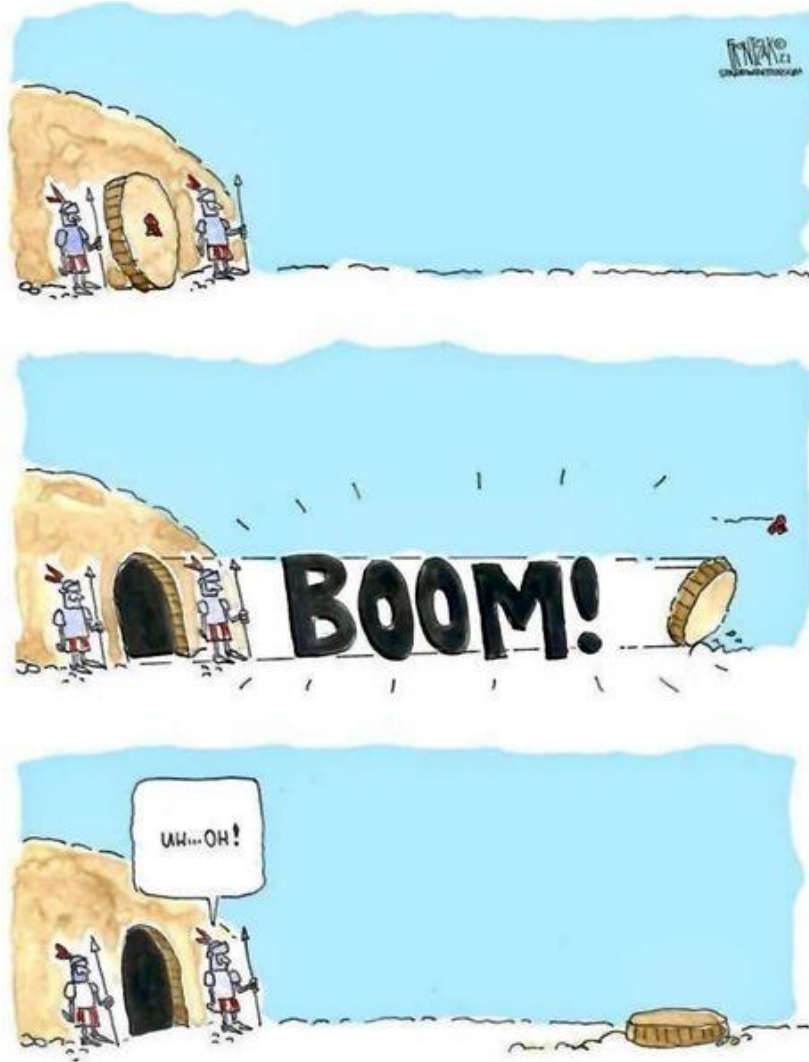

Although Easter was on March 31st, I am waiting until April for my Easter reflection. I am also using April for an on-going Lenten Message. Campus Corner - CCA

Thank you to the many people who attended CCA's Winter Extravaganza on February 24th. The night was filled with a great meal, several silent auction items, a wonderful live auction, refreshments, and music to add to the fun. Thank you for donating to and supporting our largest fundraiser of the school year. Also thank you to the Winter Extravaganza planning committee members and all the volunteers who helped make this a successful event!

On February 26, our Christ Child Academy 7th and 8th graders competed in the 54th Annual Roncalli Math Bowl in Manitowoc. Twenty-seven students participated. Students were divided up into teams of four. Due to our numbers, we had a few teams of three. Students completed a written test as a team and then competed individually to earn additional team points. The competition was stiff and included a total of 24 teams from around the region. Every part of the competition was timed and test items were extremely challenging! CCA not only had a good number of participants, but one of our 8th-grade teams took 1st place overall despite being at a disadvantage with only three team members! Two 8th graders were also the first and second-place top individual scorers overall, respectively. They each received medals and brought home a trophy for our school. We had two other teams finish in the top ten. Congratulations to our students and their willingness to try hard things.

Congratulations to the CCA students who competed and excelled in the K of C Council #722 Math and Spelling Knowledge Contest. Again this year, the contest was administered in the classroom in grades 5-8, during the school day, at Christ Child Academy and St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. CCA students earned 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each grade level, for both subjects except for grade 8 third place spelling which went to a student at Seton. All first place winners are eligible to compete in the Diocesan level competition that is scheduled for Saturday, March 16, 2024. The Knights of Columbus will also recognize the top three finishers at a Youth Awards presentation in May.

Grade 4 attended the annual Children's Concert held at the Stefanie H. Weill Center. The performance is hosted by the Sheboygan Symphony and Sheboygan Area School District. The students are introduced to orchestral music and to various instruments that comprise the orchestra.

Christ Child Academy will be administering the Wisconsin Forward Assessment in grades 3 through 8. The Wisconsin Forward Exam is an online summative assessment (measuring students' cumulative progress from the past school year) that is administered in ELA and mathematics for grades 3 through 8, and in science and social studies for grades 4 and 8. The assessment is designed to gauge how well students are doing in relation to the Wisconsin Academic Standards. These standards outline what students should know and be able to do in order to be career and college ready.

The middle school students have been preparing and mailing birthday cards for the Birthday Card Ministry each month. This is a great way for the students to give back to parishioners and help make their birthday special.

The CCA students and staff wish everyone a very Happy Easter!

We will be hosting the 12th Annual Christ Child Academy Golf Outing on Sunday, May 19th at Riverdale Country Club in Sheboygan. This is a 4-person best ball scramble with a 1:00 pm shot-gun start.
