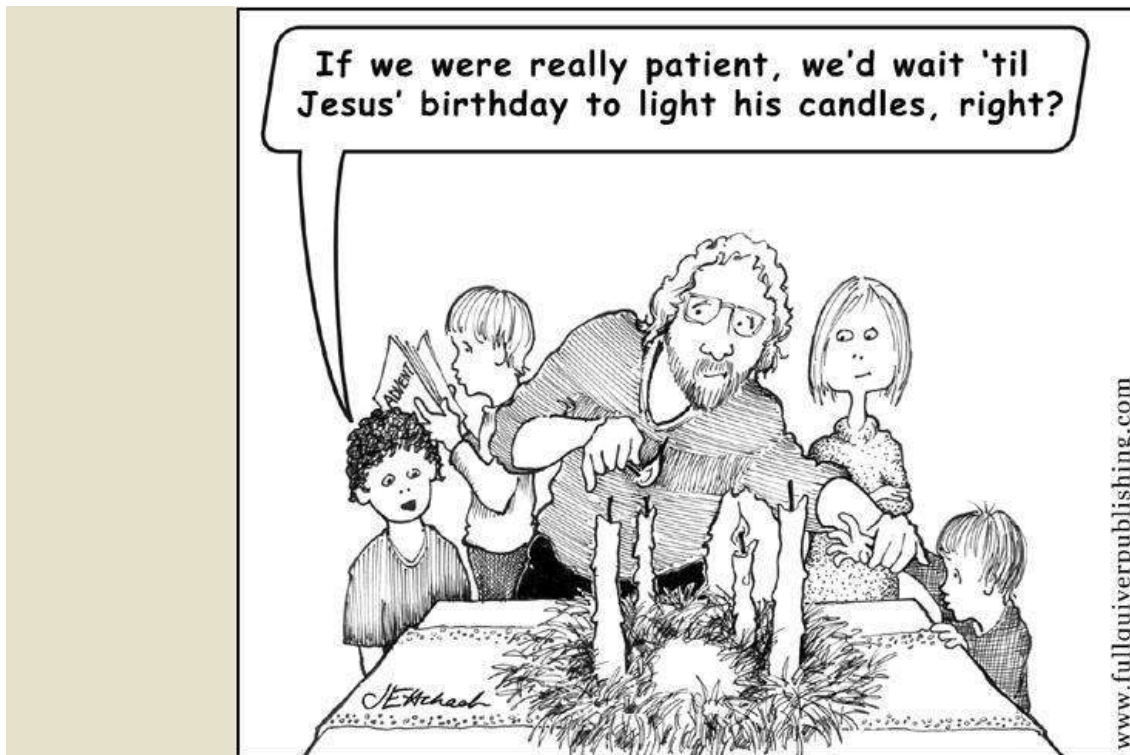

Brother Knights and Families,

WOW where did 2023 year go. I thought I just wrote my Thanksgiving column. I subscribe to “Loose-leaf Lectionary for Mass” published by Liturgical Press. It contains weekday, weekend, and other feast day readings and homilies by various people. Thankfully it comes quarterly, so I was able to get this Christmas reflection.

This month we celebrate the feast of Christmas, the incarnation—the coming of Jesus, the Light, the Son of God, into our world. Jesus came and we rejoice in this fact. Jesus was rejected by the very people to whom he came for. Have things changed that much in two thousand years?

We look at our world and wonder if the Prince of Peace has made any progress in his struggle to find acceptance in society. Thousands starve throughout the world because the Light is not accepted. Violence eclipses peace in our streets. Wars and disharmony plague society. Racial tensions continue in many parts of the world. Where is the comfort and salvation of God? With all the problems and bad news today, we may wonder what significance Jesus' birth in Bethlehem has for us. The answer is totally up to us. An event that happened over two thousand years ago must be applied today if it is to find relevance and meaning! If we do nothing to make Jesus' presence meaningful for our world, then Christ's rejection will continue. Jesus brought light so that a people in darkness would never be fearful again. Therefore, let us welcome the newborn Prince of Peace. Let us allow the miracle of Jesus' birth to change us forever!

A month ago, I went Bow hunting for deer with my son and one of my grandsons. It was a great time with them in a beautiful spot in Southwestern Wisconsin along the Mississippi. As some of you may know, when you go hunting you must get up and out to the stand before the sun comes up. As you walk out to your spot through the dark wooded area, you sometimes have just enough moonlight to navigate your way while trying not to step on anything that would disturb the silence of the night,

Occasionally, you step on a twig and when you hear the snap, you cringe as you hear something in the darkness run away from you. Finally, you get to your preselected spot and find a log to sit on facing the direction that you predict the deer may be coming from. Then you wait,...and you wait,...and you wait. While waiting, you notice the birds start to chirp and flutter in the darkness around you. As the sun gets closer to the horizon, some nearby details come into clearer view. Then a squirrel rustles the dry leaves while scavenging for something it thought it had buried. All this while, more vivid details surround you that remained a blur up until then.

During this season of Advent, Christians all over the world are in waiting. We are waiting for a Savior that will come as a little child, "Immanuel" (God is with us). Yet as we welcome this child/God each year, we as Catholic Christians believe that He is with us always in the Word, the Church, the Eucharist, and each other. But how can we make this clearer and more our focus when challenged by difficult people or situations? By letting in the "Son".

Like my experience during that early morning hunt, when the "Son's" light enters our day, our surroundings become brighter, and we see opportunities around us to make a difference in the lives of others. (Continued on next page)

The CCA Student Service Council once again sponsored our annual November Food Drive for the Sheboygan South Catholic Parish Food Pantry. Each week we collected various items for donation to the pantry. We collected canned food items, boxed items and personal care items for each of the three weeks before Thanksgiving. Our students collected over 800 items this year. This is a wonderful way to put our Christian values to work.

We recently kicked off the Christ Child Academy Annual Fund! Our 2023-2024 annual goal is to raise \$50,000.

Christ Child Academy honored our Veterans with a ceremony held in the Staskunas Activity Center/Gym on Friday, November 10th. The ceremony included the students and staff praying, reciting the Pledge of Allegiance, as well as singing "God Bless America."

This school year, we will be selling Winter Extravaganza raffle tickets rather than the calendar raffles. The winning raffles will be drawn at Winter Extravaganza, although there is no need to be present to win. The grand prize is \$2,500 with three others winning \$1000, \$500, and \$250. Our 6th and 7th graders helped move over 50 roasters and all the fixings up from the basement and down to the gym in preparation for the Thanksgiving dinner prepared and offered here annually. Our adult volunteers sure appreciated our young people lending a hand to help those in need.

CCA will be holding its annual Christmas band concert at 6:00 on Tuesday, December 5, in the gym, and our Christmas choral concert is scheduled for Tuesday, December 12. All are welcome for some Christmas cheer!

As we prepare for Christmas, Christ Child Academy students will be attending Reconciliation during the Advent season.

Our Christmas break begins on Friday, December 22 and we will be back in session on January 2. Happy Christmas to all our KC friends and thank you for your continued support!
