May is always a very busy and exciting time at CCA! We started the month off by enjoying a wonderful spring concert performed by the CCA Band and K-8 students. Thank you to the students and Mr. Ryan Kautzer, our director, for blessing us with up-lifting songs. It is always a pleasure to see our children's gifts displayed. Also, thank you to Mrs. Judy Wilsing for her accompaniment on the piano.

We then celebrated May Crowning and Grandparents Day. There were many grandparents and parents who joined us for school Mass, and a traditional Mary crowning followed by treats and visits to the classrooms to view student's work and meet their teachers.

The 11th Annual Christ Child Academy Golf Outing was on Sunday, May 21st at Riverdale Country Club in Sheboygan. This 4-person best ball scramble included a brat/burger at the turn and an hors d'oeuvre social after golf. This year was well attended and we were blessed (for the first time in years) with a beautiful sunny day.

Our fifth and seventh grade students recently visited the Sheboygan County Court House for a Law Day program. The objective was to see how the legal system/judicial branch of the U.S. Government functions. Students participated in a mock trial where they were assigned roles as jurors, defendants, prosecutors, and defense attorneys. Thank you to the Honorable Angela Sutkiewicz for hosting this program each year.
