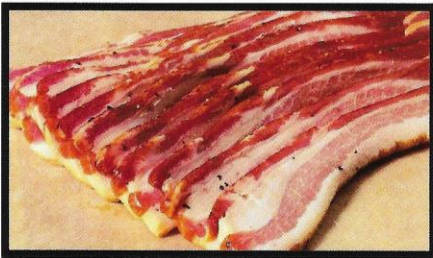

Fourth Degree News  
From Your Faithful Navigator

Worthy Sir Knights and Ladies,

Here we are at the end of our fiscal year for our 4th Degree Assembly. Our final meeting will be at the K of C clubhouse on June 19th, with 6:00 gathering for social time and 7:00 call to order. During that meeting we will also have the installation of our new officers. That being said, (though this is likely the last column for the newsletter that I write), it has been a grace and privilege to have been your Faithful Navigator this past year.

I know of many people who are following “The Chosen” series quite closely as my wife and I have for several years. We find it to be a great depiction of the life and mission of Jesus Christ and His Apostles. The characters and how Jesus may have dealt with different situations seem so practical and endearing.

There are, however, some variations in the script that stray from truth as understood through our Catholic Faith. One variation that was brought to my attention by a letter sent to the director of the production, Dallas Jenkins. The letter was written by Sheryl Collmer who is Catholic and has a master’s degree in theological studies. It’s about a sentence that Peter replies to Jesus at the end of the newly released series 4 which has Jesus mounting the donkey that will carry Him into Jerusalem on what we call, “Palm Sunday.”

In this script, Jesus asks His Apostles: “will you desert me?” then Peter responds: “Where else will we go?” This may sound a bit trite, but as Catholics we should have all stood up in the theater and walked out in protest. The writers surgically removed the conversation which led into the “Bread of Life” discourse from John chapter 6 and transplanted it into

The 4K Preschool class recently visited Quonset Farms in Gibbsville. The children learned about the process of milk from the cow to their glass.

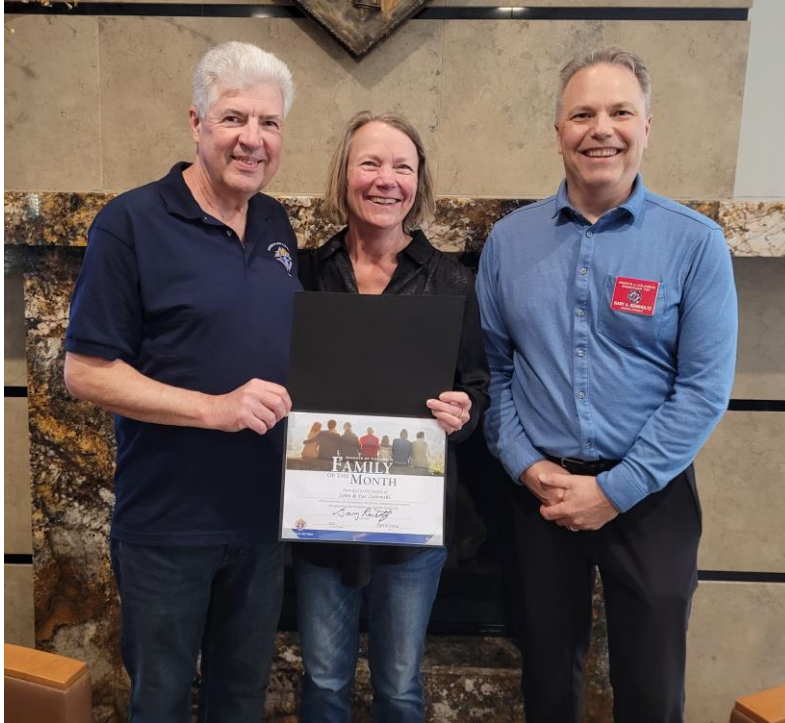
