

Pentecost (May 19) is considered the birthday of the Church. The empowerment of the Holy Spirit gave them the courage to go forth and proclaim the truth of Christ as Divine Son of God and Savior. The following reflection I taken from my preaching resource "The Loose-Leaf Lectionary."

We live in a world that seems to be filled with darkness. Just one glance at the world and we see a place that is filled with poverty, pollution, racism, climate change, refugees, forgivelessness, terrorism, and the war. It may seem like much of the world is running directionless. Much like the disciples after Jesus' death, it may seem like the darkness has conquered the light.

I imagine this is something that we feel when we turn on the news, or when a loved one passes away, or when nothing in our life seems to be going right.

On Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate how in some of the darkest moments, the Holy Spirit is our beacon of light. Through the apostle's words and actions, they were able to bring God's light to all people. They were no longer fearful for they were guided by the Holy Spirit.

We carry the light of the Holy Spirit. We can spread this light through actions as simple as charity, patience, courage, forgiveness, self-control, joy, peace and love. With every small action the light and love of the Holy Spirit can spread throughout the world and the event that occurred on Pentecost Day endures today.

Worthy Sir Knights and Ladies,

We say it again Fellow Sir Knights, Happy Easter! We are now in the sixth week of Easter and have an eve looking forward to the Ascension of our Lord into Heaven. Let's spend a few moments reflecting on that moment as if we were standing with the Apostles, watching as Jesus is rising out of our sight. We would be wondering as they did, what do we do now? Has all that we encountered, the forty days of Lent, His suffering and dying on the cross, the rumors of His Resurrection, then actually seeing-touchingconversing and eating with Him. In what ways have we changed, if at all? What do we do now? I have had several funerals recently, for some who are very dear to me, and one that would have been my own great-granddaughter. One stark reality of who we are as followers of Christ, came to me during a reading selected for the funeral from Saint Paul's letter to the Romans, (6:3-4):" we who were baptized into Christ Jesus, were also baptized into His death." To paraphrase that then, death should no longer have power over us. We should no longer cower over criticism of what we believe. I invite you all to check out this link provided here which will take you to a talk between Fr. Mike Schmitz and Jeff Cavins on The Bible Timeline Show. It's called, "What would you die for?" it focuses on the second Book of Maccabees in the Old Testament. If you're using a Bible to follow the talk, make sure that it's a Catholic version, because if it's not you won't find it, as well as several others that were only included in the Catholic Canon.

Hope to see you all on May 15th at the K of C Center for the 5:30 Memorial Mass with the social time to follow the call to order at 7 PM.
