Chaplain's Column

Brother Knights and Families,

The month of October is dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary whose feast is October 7th. This is a brief explanation from the Loose-Leaf Lectionary published by the Liturgical Press”.

This feast was instituted by Pope Saint Pius V on the anniversary of the naval victory won by the Christian forces over a powerful pagan force at Lepanto in 1571. A victory attributed to the Mother of God whose aid had been invoked through the holy Rosary. The celebration is a stimulus to all to meditate on the mysteries of Christ under the guidance of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was so closely associated with the incarnation, passion, and glorious resurrection of the Son of God.

Whether we pray the Rosary regularly, occasionally, or not at all, the mysteries of the Rosary challenge us to live out life in imitation of Christ's truths. What does that mean to us? Reflect on this prayer from St. Teresa of Calcutta:

DO IT ANYWAY

People are often unreasonable, irrational, and self-centered.

Forgive them anyway.

If you are kind, people may accuse you of selfish ulterior motives.

Be kind anyway.

If you are successful, you will win some unfaithful friends and some genuine enemies,

Succeed anyway.

If you are honest and sincere, people may deceive you,

Be honest and sincere anyway.

What you spend years creating, others could destroy overnight.

Create anyway.

If you find serenity and happiness, some may be jealous.

Be happy anyway.

The good you do today, will often be forgotten,

Do good anyway.

Give the best you have, and it will never be enough.

Give your best anyway.

In the final analysis, it is between you and God.
It was never between you and them anyway.
