

Pope Francis' Prayer Intentions for May

Vatican City, 1 May 2023 (VIS) – The Holy Father's prayer intention for May – For Church movements and groups "We pray that Church movements and groups may rediscover their mission of evangelization each day, placing their own charisms at the service of needs in the world."

May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary and her title of Our Lady of Fatima. The Feast is May 13th. This is the 106th Anniversary of her appearances to the 3 children in Fatima, Portugal between May 13th and Oct 13th, 1917. She identified herself as Our Lady of the Rosary. She stressed the importance of repentance, conversion of heart, and dedication to her Immaculate Heart through daily recitation of the Rosary. May we heed Mary's call to conversion of heart so that the world might be a better place for all. All of Mary's Feast days and titles are established on these 2 basic truths about her. Her response to the Archangel Gabriel "I am the servant of the Lord, let it be done to me according to His word !!!." Then her response to the waiters at the wedding feast: "Do what he commands you to do!" We know how Jesus wants us to act! May Mary intercede for us to follow the values of Jesus.

How time passes by! It doesn't seem that my 50th Anniversary celebration was 5 years ago. I saved the cards and recently re-read them. Many of them had very personal remarks meaningful to me. I enjoy being Council 722 and Assembly Chaplain. I trust that my Newsletter and meeting reflections are meaningful for you. The National K of C office, each local Council, and Assembly have a strong interest in developing vocations. For a very good reason the Sheboygan Council no longer has a Clergy Appreciation night in May. Let's use the May 17th Assembly Mass as a time to pray for vocations. If it is ready, I will bless the Chalice that will be given to a newly ordained priest. The names of our recently deceased members (May 2022 thru April) are inscribed on the bottom.

My silver chalice that I use at the Assembly Mass also has significant meaning. It was a gift from my Mom and Dad when I was Ordained. After my mom died on March 7th 1986 her mothers ring with 4 stones and 2 small diamonds from earrings that my Dad gave her one Christmas were placed in the base of the Chalice that I use at my Masses, every day. My Dad died Dec. 9th 1999 just 6 months short of his 100th birthday.
