Campus Corner - CCA

CCA students in grades 5-8 will take turns participating in the St. Peter Claver Food Pantry each month from October through May. The SPC Food Pantry will play a large part in how we prepare students to live as Christ did. Students will volunteer in the pantry to garner first-hand experience at how their work impacts their neighborhood.

Christ Child Academy recently had a visit from Kristen Kirchhaine, meteorologist from TMJ4. The students learned about Wisconsin weather, the changing seasons, how to become a meteorologist, and they toured the Storm Chaser vehicle.

The CCA students, staff, and parents participated in the "National Walk to School Day". The walk began at Lakeshore Lanes, with walkers proudly representing CCA in their school Mass apparel. What a wonderful representation for Christ Child Academy!

The Sheboygan Fire Department conducted safety and fire prevention education for Kindergarten through 4th grade at Fire Station #3 this past Monday. This education program is valuable for reinforcement of fire safety messages for children as they grow and develop safe behaviors.

October was National Bullying Prevention Month and Christ Child Academy joined the STOMP Out Bullying campaign. The goal was to encourage communities to work together to stop bullying and cyber bullying by increasing awareness of the prevalence and impact of bullying on all children of all ages. Each Tuesday CCA had a theme with a corresponding dress up day: "Put bullying to rest" by wearing pajamas to school; "We're all on the same team" by wearing your favorite jersey to school; "Unity Day" by wearing an orange shirt in support of National Bullying Prevention Month; and "Hats off to good choices" by wearing a favorite hat to school. This helps reinforce what the students learn.
